Dear General Richard B. Meyers, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and Michael Chertoff, Secretary of Homeland Security:

As a proud, patriotic American Artist, I feel it is my duty to bring to your attention a gaping hole in our nation's current security and defense strategy: Subversive Art. One minute surfing the Internet is all that is required to discover that foreign art from rogue nations, terrorist enclaves and subversive art galleries has thoroughly infiltrated our nation's cities and towns.
